THE ACADEMY

Saint Joseph Academy was founded in 1890 by the Congregation of St. Joseph. Today it is the only accredited private high school for young women in the city of Cleveland. The Academy is operated by a Board of Directors and is sponsored by the Sisters of the Congregation of St. Joseph. The Academy is located on a 44-acre campus in the West Park area of the city of Cleveland. The Academy's student body comes from the city of Cleveland as well as the surrounding suburban communities and counties.

Saint Joseph Academy is accredited by the Ohio Catholic School Accrediting Association and AdvancEd. The student to faculty ratio at Saint Joseph Academy is twelve to one. Sixty-nine percent of the faculty hold advanced degrees and have an average of 15 years of teaching experience.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION AND SPECIAL PROGRAMS

The minimum requirements for graduation from Saint Joseph Academy are 28 units that include four credits in Theology. Every student must carry a minimum of six full credits, including Theology each year. Beginning with the Class of 2011 all students must have 4 units of Math. Beginning with the Class of 2012 all students must have 2 units of Foreign Language.

The school has been on an intensive block schedule beginning in the 1997-1998 school year.

All students must complete twenty Christian service hours each year.

A two year Pre-Engineering program is offered to qualified students.

COLLEGE FACTS AND FINAL GRADE DISTRIBUTION FOR THE CLASS OF 2010

Among the 2010 graduates, 95% enrolled in higher education, with 88% attending four year colleges and 12% attending two-year community/career colleges. 57% attended state supported institutions, 43% attended private colleges, and 27% attended Catholic institutions. Also, 5% will enter the work force or were undecided.
